The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The principal activity of the Bhawan during the year, which has remained unchanged from previous years, was that of the advancement of Hinduism in accordance with its Constitution.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Significant activities

During the year all the major functions and festivals were celebrated. Shri Amba Maa, Hanuman Chalisa and Shri Balaji Puja are conducted on Tuesdays and Sundays respectively, with Shree Satya Narayan Puja taking place on every purnima in the month. Hindi classes are held on Saturdays, 50+ club and SGB Community Centre were fully operational. **Upnishad** regular weekly classes on Monday's evenings continued. Several Saints visited the Bhawan and delivered spiritual discourses to promote Hinduism. SGB maintained regular visits of School children's to learn Hinduism and hundreds of children from various schools visited the Bhawan. A unique event of **Vedic Homatmak Maha Rudra Yagya** was performed during 20th to 23rd June 2013 under spiritual guidance of our Head Priest Acharya Dharm Dutt Vasistha along with 21 eminent priests and scholars.

During the year planning permission was received for the extension of the kitchen and dining hall. The committee is in the process of obtaining building regulations and further consultation with Architects and Engineers to take this further.

We sincerely thank the Managing Committee and Devotees for their co-operation and support, on which the achievement of aims and objectives of the Bhawan depends.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

During the year SGB charity achieved registration for **Gift Aid** following time consuming effort by the Treasurer with members of Executive Committee. In this year SGB charity being able to claim £25,660 from Gift Aid, and will benefit it in the future.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Review and progress

The incoming resources during the year amounted to £297,666 and expenditure including depreciation amounted to £181,296 leaving the surplus for the year of £116,370, which was transferred to general reserve fund. The statement of financial activities are shown on page 4 with relevant notes thereto on pages 6 to 9.

Reserves policy

The Trustees review the reserves policy which include a consideration of the nature of the income and expenditure stream, the requirement to match variable income with fixed commitments and a consideration of the nature of the reserves. As a result of this review it will be noted that at the end of the financial year on 31 March 2014, the Bhawan's unrestricted funds amounted to £2,140,718 of which £1,583,945 is invested in fixed assets with revaluations of (£32,278) leaving £524,495 as freely available. This was concluded to be an adequate figure to allow the charity to be managed efficiently and to ensure that sufficient resources were available to provide uninterrupted services.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

SGB Management Committee is in the process of acquiring neighbouring properties for further expansion.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF SHREE GEETA BHAWAN

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2014 set out on pages four to nine.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is required. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of ACCA.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Act 2011 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Allocation and apportionment of costs

Support costs consisting of office and administrative costs of the Bhawan including staff salaries have been split between charitable and governance activities on the basis of estimated time spent and its usages of each activity.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property - 2% on straight line basis
Fixtures and fittings - 15% on reducing balance
Computer equipment - 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
